A personal message from the Chair (+Pic)

Chief Executive update (+Pic)

Buckinghamshire Thames Valley Local Enterprise Partnership continues to be one of the top performing LEP's in the country, supported by incredible enthusiasm from business, a dedicated Chair and board of directors, and a great team.

This year we have seen a flurry of projects come to fruition right across Buckinghamshire. We're on track to unlock delivery of around £300 million of total investment in Buckinghamshire that will fundamentally improve our economy and future-proof our infrastructure. And, as we reflect on progress to date, it's important that we continue to be ambitious and aspirational for Buckinghamshire.

Our economy faces an exciting future, and BTVLEP and our partners are working hard to make sure we maximise the potential for business growth across the county.

Bucks is a significant wealth generator for the UK economy, and the commitment of over £73m in Local Growth Funds is unleashing ambition and creativity in the county. Buckinghamshire Thames Valley Local Enterprise Partnership (BTVLEP) is one of 38 Local Enterprise Partnerships operating across England. We are considered by Government to be amongst the most successful in terms of our strategic outlook, operational delivery and exceptional reach and insight into the business community.

BTVLEP is a business led private and public sector partnership that aims to promote local economic growth and prosperity. Acting as a strategic gateway to funding, we support and deliver projects of long-term economic benefit for all in Buckinghamshire.

Our work is primarily concerned with enabling sustainable and productive economic growth through creating more jobs, up-skilling our workforce and by providing the vital supporting infrastructure and housing – read on to find out how are we doing this.

Building on a strong and successful economy

Buckinghamshire's economy goes from strength to strength. Our businesses have the 4th highest productivity rates in the country with the GVA (Gross Value Added) per hour worked more than 10% above the national average, significantly better than our neighbouring areas in Bedfordshire, Oxfordshire and Hertfordshire. In addition, Buckinghamshire has the highest employment rate in the Oxford-Cambridge Arc at 82 per cent compared with the 75 per cent for England.

Good Growth puts Bucks Thames Valley LEP at the top (+Pic)

Good Growth for Cities 2018 index has placed BTVLEP as the second highest performing LEP area in England! We are delighted to be rated as a top area for the most improved and overall ranking for good growth. Being located at the heart of the Oxford-Cambridge Arc we recognise that the strength in this region comes from collaboration across city, town and rural areas. That is why three LEPs (Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and South East Midlands) and the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority are working together to use our trailblazing Local Industrial Strategies as the basis for a combined economic vision to support future investment and good growth.

But we are not complacent and we continue to support our high potential businesses and key growth sectors to flourish and grow further and access new national and international markets.

Buckinghamshire is home to iconic business brands and locations: Pinewood, the National Film and Television School, Silverstone, the National Space Propulsion Facility (at Westcott Venture Park) and Stoke Mandeville, the birthplace of the Paralympic Movement, along with businesses such as Bosch, McAfee, ESRI, Silverson, and Cisco.

It has a highly productive economy with a dynamic and resilient employment base underpinned by a strong and high-quality SME business community. Our grammar schools lead the way in the best performing schools' system in the country, Buckinghamshire is a draw for talent, with evidence showing we have the best educated workforce in the land.

Buckinghamshire lies at the heart of the Oxford-Cambridge Arc, one of the UK's key growth regions with London and the UK's international gateway at Heathrow close by.

Our primary objective is to mobilise each of Buckinghamshire's internationally significant economic assets, enabling the growth of clusters of businesses that are pioneers in their fields and raising productivity nationally, across the Oxford-Cambridge Arc and in Buckinghamshire.

Our purpose-built business Growth Hub, Buckinghamshire Business First, is a major strength. Representing a membership of over 11,000 businesses including almost 70% of the local private

sector workforce, Buckinghamshire Business First is helping make Bucks one of the best places to start, run and grow a new business.

We are vital in delivering the national growth agenda, all the evidence suggests that Buckinghamshire, like many other county economies, although rural and without a city, remains a critically important investment channel in underpinning economic growth and national industrial strategy.

Bucks blazing a trail (+Pic)

The BTVLEP area has been chosen by government as one of the trailblazer areas for developing a Local Industrial Strategy. These are long-term strategies aim to boost productivity-led growth and will shape the investment decisions in the area for the future. We are also working with our partners at SEMLEP, Oxfordshire and Cambridgeshire on a joint Growth Arc economic vision.

Over the past six years we have secured over £100m worth of direct investment into Buckinghamshire, unlocking a total investment of over £300m.

Increasing prosperity and growth - Local Growth Fund

Bucks is a major wealth generator for the UK economy, and the commitment of over £73m in Local Growth Funds is unleashing ambition and creativity across the county. This funding is enabling the delivery of new road and rail infrastructure, better skills and business opportunities and enhancing digital connectivity to support sustainable economic growth in Buckinghamshire.

Investment secures new road scheme for Bucks (+Pic)

BTVLEP Local Growth Funding of £6.05m provided a new road scheme to improve the resilience and performance of Buck's highway network, and enhance strategic north/south connectivity for the county. Without Beaconsfield's new relief road, the county would be put at a disadvantage in terms of transport access across the county and the knock-on effects to economic growth.

There's certainly plenty to shout about, in the past 12 months our Local Growth Fund investment has helped support new educational facilities at the world-leading National Film and Television School, new facilities for the creative industries and construction and motor trades have been created at the Buckinghamshire College Group sites, and the new Vinson Centre for Entrepreneurship at the University of Buckingham, along with investment in infrastructure projects such as High Wycombe Town Centre Master Plan and the A355 Improvement Scheme. This performance in our Local Growth Fund has enabled BTVLEP to be graded 'excellent' for delivery in the Government's annual assessment of Local Enterprise Partnerships – one of only four LEPs to achieve this!

Push off for high-performance cycling centre (+Pic)

BTVLEP invested £2m of its Local Growth Funds in the development of a new 26,000 sq. ft. state-of-the-art sports engineering innovation centre. Situated in BTVLEP's Silverstone Enterprise Zone, the Silverstone Sports Engineering Hub, which is owned by TotalSim Ltd, will establish a research, development and business incubation centre for British high-performance cycling – the first of its kind in the UK.

New funding supporting growth of Bucks creative sector

Buckinghamshire's creative sector is world renowned and we want to do everything we can to support and continue its growth. BTVLEP were therefore delighted to announced £4 million in funding to support three new initiatives – 'The National Centre for Immersive Storytelling', 'School of Computing and Centre for Al' and 'Bucks Creates @ Pinewood' – to strengthen and build Buckinghamshire's creative sector, a key growth driver of the local economy.

Firing up major investment - Growing Places Fund

BTVLEP is investing, recycling and re-investing its £8.1m Growing Places Fund on projects that offer great returns for Bucks on jobs, business critical infrastructure and growth.

We have already demonstrated our ability to deliver an ambitious programme. 100% of our Growing Places Funding has been used to kick-start the regeneration of the town centres and access gateways in Aylesbury and High Wycombe, as well as supporting tourism and BTVLEP's skills and wider growth programmes.

European funding continues to secure jobs and growth in Bucks

The 2014 to 2020 European Structural and Investment Funds (ESIF) bring the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF), European Social Fund (ESF) and part of the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD) together into a single Growth Programme for England. This supports our key growth priorities of innovation, research and development, support for small and medium sized enterprises, low carbon, skills, employment, and social inclusion.

Businesses and communities across Buckinghamshire have benefited from £10.9m of European funding, secured by BTVLEP, for growth and jobs. Projects supported by this funding include:

• Skills Brokerage Service

Identifying training opportunities to increase the productivity of over 1,000 Buckinghamshire based businesses.

Low Carbon Workspaces

Awards grants between £1,000 and £5,000 to help small to medium sized business enterprises (SME) in Buckinghamshire install energy saving projects.

Rural Funding

Awards to support the development and diversification in our rural and tourism businesses.

• Halo Growth Programme

Businesses can access either tailored business growth advice or £1,000 Growth Grants.

• Business Incubation Space

Our European programme funding has enabled business incubation and support services to be established in High Wycombe, Stoke Mandeville and at Westcott, providing invaluable support for start-ups and growing businesses in the health, social care and space and rocket propulsion sectors.

Amazing facts about Bucks (full page image)

- **Pinewood Studios**, opened in 1936 by J Arthur Rank, filmed the first James Bond Film Dr No in 1962 and in 2016 Pinewood became home to the world's first e-games organisation.
- Westcott Venture Park became Britain's first dedicated rocket and engine test centre in 1946, and in 2016 funding was received from the UK Space agency to establish the first space propulsion catapult testing facility.
- Beaconsfield's National Film and Television School, which opened in 1972, was named first in the list of top 15 international film schools and has recently launched of one of the UKs first 4x Digital Content Training Studios.
- Princes Risborough based Hypnos is the only active bed supplier to the Royal Family and in 2012 Hypnos became the first UK Bedmaker to achieve the carbon neutrality standard.
- The world's first carbon neutral dairy is run by **Arla** in Aylesbury.
- The first Stoke Mandeville Games, precursor to the Paralympic Games, were held in Stoke Mandeville in 1948.
- Lucian Ercolani, founder of iconic furniture brand Ercol, drew his inspiration from the time proven local design and craft in the Chiltern Hills and in 1920 built his first factory in High Wycombe.
- **Silverstone** held the first formula 1 Grand Prix in Britain in 1950 and in 2016 opened the country's first metrology (the science of measurement) facility.

We have worked with our partners to identify an approach for directing and prioritising our activity and achieving improved business productivity. As a result of this approach, we have achieved great success during 2018/19.

Buckinghamshire's economic position relative to other LEP areas remains strong with high rates of economic participation, low unemployment, a well skilled workforce and a strong enterprise base. But there are major challenges! The fact is that we are a largely rural county whose digital, road and rail infrastructure needs critical new investment.

Our Strategic Economic Plan highlights local aims to deliver increased prosperity and jobs for Buckinghamshire by putting any available funds to work, focusing on better transport connectivity, helping businesses to grow faster, and bringing business and education together more fruitfully.

What we aim to do

The focus for BTVLEP is in preparing the ground for continued prosperity through enabling sustainable economic growth:

- To get the right economic growth decisions taken more quickly;
- To stimulate more smart and sustainable business growth in the county;
- To bring forward the necessary business-critical infrastructure;
- To secure the inward investment needed to underpin growth;
- To ensure the supply of the skilled, flexible workforce needed by our firms.

We use BTVLEPs powerful national, regional and local voice to ensure that critical infrastructure projects such as East-West Rail and Cross-rail are delivered on schedule. We are currently supporting the case to advance development for business-critical national infrastructure projects such as the Oxford-Cambridge Expressway and the expansion of Heathrow airport.

Bucks space cluster launch takes UK beyond the final frontier (+Pic)

Business-led and focused

Buckinghamshire Thames Valley LEP is 100% business-led and focused, with a Private Sector Board and 11,000 businesses now engaged with our Local Growth Hub, Buckinghamshire Business First.

Our strategy and projects have been shaped by thousands of local business owners through their direct involvement with Buckinghamshire Business First, at regular roundtable 'Think Tank' events, Business Leaders' Dinners, workshops and a multitude of other networking opportunities.

Bucks Business First setting the standards for others to follow (+Pic)

Our Business Growth Hub is the envy of almost every Local Enterprise Partnership in England and it has been another successful year for top performing Buckinghamshire Business First. There's plenty to shout about, having delivered £1.8 million in grants to businesses, provided nearly 10,000 business support interactions, and facilitated nearly 700 new jobs through their activity over the past 12 months. Representing more than 30% of the county's businesses, and more than 70% of the county's private sector employees, Buckinghamshire Business First continues to set the standard for others to follow.

Delivery partnerships

Buckinghamshire Advantage, our joint delivery vehicle, has bridged the gap between public and private sectors. Its mission is to identify new opportunities, remove barriers to sustainable development and add value to planned development by promoting growth.

Buckinghamshire Advantage has accelerated the development and delivery of a variety of projects and schemes, including the Aylesbury Woodlands mixed use development covering over 200ha of employment led development to the east of Aylesbury, providing much needed new road infrastructure and supporting the growth of the Aylesbury Garden Town programme.

Buckinghamshire Advantage has also enabled the Handy Cross development in High Wycombe and the Aylesbury Waterside, and is now pumping investment into our Enterprise Zone sites.

Enterprise Zones taking Bucks beyond the final frontier (+map)

Since 2016 Enterprise Zone status has provided an enormous boost to help Buckinghamshire grow our existing businesses and attract and accelerate new investment in key business sectors at our three strategically important Enterprise Zone sites.

The scale and special nature of the development, the mix of uses and the highly strategic position, at the heart of the 'Golden Triangle' and the 'Oxford to Cambridge Arc' enables the Aylesbury Vale Enterprise Zone sites to compete internationally as major new employment locations.

Three years on, the sites at Silverstone Park, Westcott Venture Park and at Aylesbury Woodlands are driving forward the Buckinghamshire economy in the sectors of high-performance engineering, space technology and life sciences – all critical to the national economy and just as importantly securing business rate returns to be reinvested into the local business community.

Working with our Enterprise Zone partners – MEPC, Rockspring and DB Symmetry - there are currently exciting investment and development opportunities across all of our sites.

At **Silverstone** (+Pic) the first phase of the Enterprise Zone, consisting 125,000 sq. ft. of new employment space, built by MEPC, is now full attracting businesses of the calibre of Virgin Racing, the World Champion Mercedes-AMG Petronas Formula 1 Team, David Brown Automotive and Twintec Baumont. £5m of retained business rates has been invested into a new multi-utility trench to advance the development of future phases of development, and a further £2m of Local Growth Funding has been committed to develop a new Innovation Centre providing business access to the UK's premier aerodynamics facility for racing cycles and sports equipment.

At **Westcott** (+Pic) a mixture of UK Government, UK Space Agency and European Funding has been secured to create a new vibrant centre for space propulsion testing and development. New facilities include a 5G test centre for unmanned automated vehicles, being managed by the Satellite Application Catapult, alongside incubation facilities for businesses operating in the sector. Reaction Engines' landmark testing facility for the ground-breaking SABRE engine will be completed later this year and work is commencing on the UK Space Agency's Innovation Centre for rocket propulsion. All this activity puts Westcott at the heart of the UK's Space Sector.

Aylesbury Woodlands (+Pic) will form one of the largest new employment sites in the south of England. The Aylesbury Woodlands development was key to Aylesbury securing Garden Town Status and will help deliver the Eastern Link road, a vital element in the transport infrastructure needed for the growth in Aylesbury and beyond. The Aylesbury Woodlands site will also provide the opportunity to develop over 1,100 homes, including 160 custom built housing units, providing a template for a viable alternative to the major housing developers. Most recently at Aylesbury Woodlands construction has commenced on over 250,000 sq. ft of new employment floorspace.

BTVLEP is supporting national logistics developer DB Symmetry, on the commencement of the exciting first phase of a 248,000 sq. ft. development at Symmetry Park. Located on BTVLEP's Aylesbury Woodlands Enterprise Zone, this major warehouse and distribution development will help to support new investment and growth for the local economy.

Opportunities for early stage businesses at Enterprise Zone (+Pic)

New entrepreneurial companies are an essential component of the vibrant innovation ecosystem needed in Bucks and BTVLEP are keen to support and encourage the development of new companies working in high value businesses sectors. The new Westcott Business Incubation Centre located in the Westcott Venture Park and part of BTVLEP's Enterprise Zone, provides incubation support for early-stage businesses and entrepreneurs looking to develop in rocket propulsion, 5G or autonomous systems.

Ensuring businesses have the right skilled workforce

The Bucks Skills Hub, by working with local schools and colleges, is connecting young people with business to develop a dynamic programme of employer engagement. An effective ecosystem of skills development and careers inspiration is evolving. While the careers inspiration work is broad, there is a focus on our identified growth sectors ensuring that young people's ambitions are aligned to where they will be needed most.

Some recent highlights include: our skills programme firmly established the Bucks Skills Show as an invaluable event to inform young people about career opportunities; we became only the second area in the country to have Enterprise Adviser coverage in all secondary schools; we developed an extensive apprenticeship support programme; and produced a detailed Labour Market insight assessment to assess the latest trends in the employment market across business sectors.

Bucks Skills Show shines bright light on future talent (+Pic)

Three thousand visitors saw careers brought to life at the Bucks Skills Show thanks to a range of interactive experiences ranging from sweetie selfies created with cutting edge 3D printing technology to immersive virtual reality demonstrations. Students, teachers and parents headed to The Gateway in Aylesbury over two days to take part in the county's largest careers fair sponsored by technology giant Bosch. Attendance at the event doubled from last year and attracted over 100 high profile exhibitors including Jaguar Land Rover, the NHS, Pinewood Studios and HS2.

Underpinning the skills programme is robust research which proves that exposing young people to at least four encounters with employers during their school career reduces their chances of leaving education or training without a job and increases their earning potential.

Lord Agnew sees careers excellence in action (+Pic)

The Parliamentary Under Secretary of State, Lord Agnew, at the Department for Education visited Bucks to see first-hand what excellent careers education really looks like. Taking place at the start of National Careers Week, the visit was an opportunity to showcase the fantastic work of BTVLEP's Skills Hub, which is making excellent progress in Bucks to improve careers awareness and skills development in all our secondary schools. The Skills Hub and its Enterprise Adviser Network (part of the Careers and Enterprise Company's national network) supported 70,000 employer-student encounters in Bucks last year and is home to one of only 20 Careers Hubs in England.

Growing our priority sectors (+Pic)

We are very excited about developing further collaboration and research capacity within our priority sectors. The iconic locations of Pinewood and Silverstone are now the focus for new business collaboration, along with our vibrant clusters in the fields of high-performance technology and film and creative industries.

For example, a BTVLEP backed bid, was one of only nine successful applications to receive funding from the Arts and Humanities Research Council to boost the UK's creative sector. The project, pioneered by the Royal Holloway University, will bring together universities, world leading creative and digital businesses. BTVLEP look forward to helping this vibrant creative cluster develop as leaders in this industry with one of the highest proportions of employment in the sector in the UK with over 17,200 jobs across 4,430 businesses.

We are also working alongside the UK Space Agency to develop the national Space Propulsion test centre in Buckinghamshire and developing integrated healthcare solutions to reduce the burden on our national health service with Buckinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust, Bucks New University and leading technology and life-science companies.

Bucks the centre of entrepreneurship (+Pic)

Developing entrepreneurship is core to BTVLEP's DNA and the new Vinson Centre for Economics and Entrepreneurship is a vital hub for new innovation and local growth. The new facilities enable the University of Buckingham to grow as one of the country's leading centres for entrepreneurship and enterprise. BTVLEP is therefore delighted to invest £3m of Local Growth Funds on this key project to create an exciting centre where business and education can interact and build on the University's internationally recognised reputation in pioneering the techniques of entrepreneurship learning.

Building the Bucks Local Industrial Strategy (+Pic)

For the year ahead, regional alignment across the Oxford to Cambridge Arc will be of vital importance. BTVLEP together with our neighbouring LEP colleagues are leading the development of one of only three trailblazer Local Industrial Strategies.

The Buckinghamshire Local Industrial Strategy focus is on how to strengthen and exploit the country's most important economic assets, assets that are distinctive to Buckinghamshire and are significant nationally and internationally. The strategies also look to support the delivery of the five themes (ideas, people, infrastructure, business environment and places) and four grand challenges (artificial intelligence, ageing society, clean growth and the future of mobility) set out in the Industrial Strategy white paper.

A consultation draft of our strategy was produced earlier this year where we sought the views of businesses, communities and individuals from across Buckinghamshire to help shape our proposal to government, with a view to the final strategy being published in summer 2019.

Ultimately the strategies will support funding bids for this area, including the new National Productivity Fund which will be launched in 2021.

Infrastructure for growth (+Pic)

Infrastructure investment is essential for the continued delivery of economic growth in Buckinghamshire. That is why BTVLEP is investing in major transport infrastructure - including the A355 improvement scheme, Aylesbury Eastern Link Road, High Wycombe Southern Transport Scheme and Stoke Mandeville Relief Road - fixing utility constraints that prevent commercial site developments and unblocking major commercial property investments which support the needs of business.

In addition, our involvement in The Greater South East Energy Hub is delivering local energy projects to aid the UK's transition to a low carbon economy, through the provision of renewable energy infrastructure and application of new technologies.

The future is digital (+Pic)

Digital connectivity is a critical factor in supporting business growth and effectiveness, that is why we have developed a new digital strategy for Bucks to see how we can improve connectivity, support the development of digital skills and invest in new tech businesses for Bucks.

Buckinghamshire has continued to make great strides in improving its digital connectivity, achieving its goal of getting to 95% superfast coverage by December 2019 sixteen months early. The county now has over 95% of its premises supplied with superfast coverage, and we continue to put plans in place for further rollout, looking to start delivery on a new £1.8million contract funded by central government in the coming year. We continue to work towards pushing the county towards 100% superfast broadband coverage, and can clearly see the appetite in local communities, as the take-up of the connections provided in contract one is the second highest in the UK.

We have also committed to supporting investment in 5G Technology to ensure that Buckinghamshire businesses have the opportunity to enjoy the competitive advantage from being at the leading edge of the next great technological leap forward.
