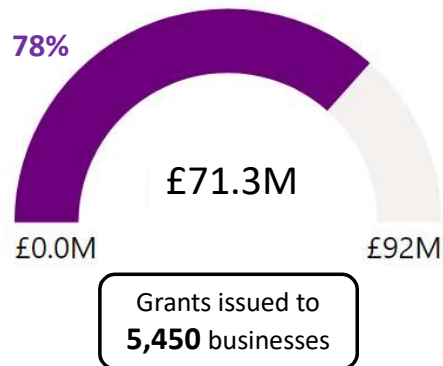
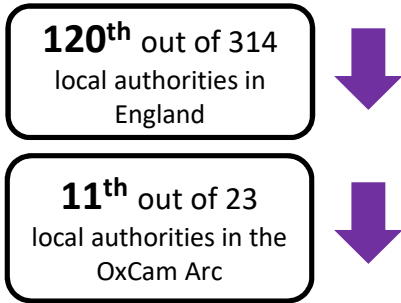


Buckinghamshire Covid-19 Business Support and Economic Impact – 11 May 2020

Labour market impact

42% of the Buckinghamshire workforce are 'critical workers'

74% of Buckinghamshire's employees are unlikely to be able to work from home

Low paid workers are over represented in both of these groups. Low paid workers are more likely to be young and are more likely to be women.

Recruitment activity in Buckinghamshire (job postings) has fallen at a slightly greater rate than nationally. Approximately **18%** drop in job in postings in April.

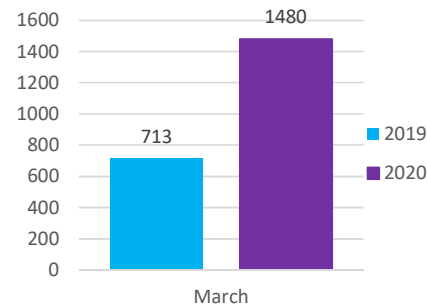
